SCHOOLING / HELMETS / DOGS

All riders must sign a waiver or entry form before schooling or riding on the grounds. All Schooling is at your own risk. Please cooperate.

Exhibitors may hack in the jumper ring until 8:45 a.m.

The Hunter Ring will be open from 6:30 AM until 7:45 AM for schooling on Saturday.

Friday night schooling will be allowed from 4:00 PM to 7:00 PM.

Helmet Rule: Sweet Briar College follows the rules of USEF. **All exhibitors must wear ASTM/SEI helmets at all times while mounted on the show grounds.** No helmet can protect the wearer against all foreseeable injuries. See Article 318.

All **dogs** must be on leashes while on the show grounds.

Oak Ridge Medal Class Open to juniors and amateurs. Over fences phase will consist of a USET-type equitation, A-O/JR jumper course of at least ten fences at least 3' 0" to 3' 3" with spreads to 4'0". The course must include a triple combination or two double combinations. A Liverpool may be used, and a time allowed (345 yards/min.) may be used in the first round. In the flat phase, competitors will show as a group at all the working gaits and the working canter on the counter canter lead for at least one full revolution of the arena in both directions. But not more than 12 riders to counter canter at a time. Flat phase to count 50%, and must run first. Top ten riders from the flat phase will be called back for the second phase; jump order to be chosen by the judge; over fences phase to count 50%. Restrictions: no martingales of any kind are permitted in the flat phase. Only properly fitted running martingales are permitted in the over fences phase. Same horse must be used in both phases; change of bridle permissible between phases. **Correct attire required.** At least three riders must complete the course to fill the class. Judges may require additional tests (USEF tests 1-19). Top fifteen cumulative point earners in qualifying classes will be invited to compete in the Oak Ridge Medal Finals; the Finals will be a three phase competition, consisting of a gymnastics phase, a flat phase, and an over fences phase. Points will be awarded: 10-6-4-2-1-.5. For complete specifications, call (540) 463-9169 or specifications should be available in the show office.

50% of all fences must be set at the height indicated and within a 5cm (2") variance. At all heights, to qualify as a spread fence, the fence must be 5cm (2") up to 15 cm (6") wider than the height.

HUNTER DIVISIONS

All Hunter Classes will be judged on performance, manners, way of going, and soundness.

“Back to Back” or “Flip Flop” courses are encouraged within each division. Please let the starter know your plans as you enter the ring. There will be no formal jogging at the end of each class. Soundness will be checked on entry and pull up from each course.

Unjudged Warm Up An unjudged warm up round to be ridden prior to your judged class. Only one round may be ridden in each section. This is planned to keep everyone warmed up and prepared.

Open Hunter Open to all riders mounted on horses or ponies. Unrecognized division. Fences 2’6” & 3’

SWVHJA Green Hunter Open to horses only in their first or second year of showing over fences of any height at any show. Fences 2’6” and 3’

SWVHJA Working Hunter Open to horses. Judged on performance, manners, and way of going. Fences 3’3” to 3’6”.

SWVHJA Adult Hunter Open to adults mounted on horses or ponies. To be judged on performance, manners, and way of going. Fences to be 3’

SWVHJA Children’s Hunter Open to juniors mounted on horses. To be judged on performance, manners, and way of going. Fences to be 3’

Pleasure Hunter Open to all riders mounted on horses or ponies. Judged on performance and soundness with emphasis on manners and suitability. Jumps at 2’.

SWVHJA Special Adult and Children’s Hunter open to horses or ponies shown by amateurs. Horse and rider combination cannot compete over fences higher than 2’9” at the same show. Fences 2’6” and 2’9”

EQUITATION CLASSES

SWVHJA Adult Equitation on the Flat Open to amateurs 18 years of age and older. To be shown at a walk, trot, and canter both ways of the ring. Judged on position, control, and guidance. USEF tests 1-18 may be used. Three entries are necessary to fill this class. Riders need not be members of SWVHJA to compete. If there are insufficient entries, this class may be combined with the Junior Equitation on the Flat. Riders must stay within their age group if class split by age.

SWVHJA Adult Medal Class Same specs as the SWVHJA Hunter Seat Medal Class except open to amateur riders 18 years of age and older. Ponies may be ridden by adults, but may not be shown in the Pony Hunter Division at the same horse show. Rider must be a member of SWVHJA.

SWVHJA Junior Equitation on the Flat Open to junior riders who have not reached their 18th birthday as of December 1st. To be shown at a walk, trot, and canter both ways of the ring. Judged on position, control, and guidance. USEF tests 1-18 may be used. Three entries are necessary to fill this class. Riders need not be members of SWVHJA to compete. If there are insufficient entries, this class may be combined with the Adult Equitation on the Flat. Riders must stay within their age group if class split by age.

SWVHJA Hunter Seat Medal Class Open to riders who have not reached their 18th birthday as of Dec. 1st of the calendar year. To be shown over a course of fences not to exceed 3’ that must include two changes of direction, a combination and at least three oxers. A minimum of six riders, if available, must be called back to work on the flat. Martingales may not be used in the flat phase. Each phase will count 50%. Same horse must be used for both phases. To qualify for the finals, a rider must accumulate 20 points. Four entries are required to fill the class with a minimum of three to complete the class. If there are fewer than four entries, this class can be combined with the Adult Medal. After a rider is qualified for the finals, he may not compete in this class. Rider must be a member of SWVHJA.

Randolph College Hunter Seat Medal Open to junior and amateur riders who have not previously qualified for the 2007, 2008 or 2009 SWVHJA Hunter Seat, SWVHJA Adult or Oak Ridge Medal Finals. The finals shall be held at the Randolph College Fall Festival Horse Show and Oak Ridge Medal Finals at the Randolph College Riding Center. The top fifteen (plus ties) point earners from qualifying classes held through the year will compete. Class to consist of two phases judged 50/50.

First phase shall be shown over a course of not less than eight fences at 2’6”. Course must contain two changes of direction after the first fence. The course does not contain an in and out. The second phase shall be shown on the flat at the walk, trot, and canter both ways of the ring. Judges may choose from USEF test 1-10. Same horse must be used for both phases. Martingales permitted in flat phase. Four (4) entries are required to hold a qualifying class at

To: All Riders, Trainers, Owners and Grooms

From: Sweet Briar College Riding Program

Upholding the welfare of the horses exhibited here is of primary concern to our management team. We require that all horses be treated with the kindness, respect and compassion they deserve. They should never be subject to mistreatment. Owners, trainers, riders and grooms, and their agents, must use reasonable care in the handling and treatment of horses owned and/or placed in their care for competition or for any other purpose.

We will provide for the continuous well being of the horses by vigorously enforcing the rules of USEF, which pertain to the welfare of the horse. Exhibitors are cautioned that Article 302, which defines the USEF's policy of Cruelty and Abuse, Article 806, which pertains to Poling, and Article 320, which pertains to the Use of Whips, will be strictly enforced. No excessive use of whips or poling will be tolerated. Violators are subject under the above rules to elimination from the competition.

Directions:

From Charlottesville – On Route 29S, take the Madison Heights/Sweet Briar College exit. Go two miles past the college entrance. Turn right just before the Best Bet/Citgo service station onto Rt. 663/Smokey Hollow Rd. Go about one mile, bearing right at the fork. At the bottom of a fairly steep hill you will see a sign for the Harriet Rogers Riding Center. Turn right.

From Lynchburg - On Route 29N Business go about ten miles past the James River to Faulconerville. After the Excel Station (on right), get in the left lane. Turn left at the Best Bet/Citgo station, driving across Route 29S onto Route 663/Smokey Hollow Road. Go about one mile, bearing right at the fork. At the bottom of a fairly steep hill you will see a sign for the Harriet Rogers Riding Center. Turn right.

From South of Lynchburg - On Route 29 N just past the Lynchburg airport, exit onto 460 East towards Appomattox. Take exit for 29 N Bypass (Charlottesville/Amherst). Exit at Route 29 Business/Amherst/Sweet Briar College. At the end of the exit turn left to go toward Sweet Briar College/Madison Heights. Go two miles past the college entrance. Turn right just before the Best Bet/Citgo service station onto Rt. 663/Smokey Hollow Rd. Go about one mile, bearing right at the fork. At the bottom of a fairly steep hill you will see a sign for the Harriet Rogers Riding Center. Turn right.

Parking:

- 1) Please watch for and follow parking signs.
- 2) Large trailers and horse vans may turn around in the parking area behind the indoor arena.
- 3) Large trailers and horse vans may park on the East side of the Riding Center or in the parking lot behind the indoor arena.

Release and Waiver of Liability

I am aware that during my participation and attendance at the Sweet Briar College Horse Show and related serves and activities, Sweet Briar College and its agents, employees and associates ("Sponsor"), will be providing various facilities and arrangements for the Show, and that certain risks and dangers may arise, including but not limited to hazards inherent in the sport(s) in which I will be training preparing or competing; negligent or other careless acts and omissions by other participants, spectators and the Sponsor; and hazardous or dangerous conditions of the facilities and grounds used as part of the horse shows.

In consideration of the acceptance of my entry by the Sponsor and the right granted to me to participate in and attend the Show and related activities, I do hereby assume all of the above risks, and agree that, in the event of any injury to me as a result of an accident which occurs during my involvement and participation in the show, my recovery against the Sponsor, shall be limited to a claim for medical expenses incurred as a result of the injury, and only to the extent that such medical expenses are not otherwise covered or paid by my insurance coverage, medical or otherwise. Furthermore, for this consideration, I agree to present any claim for personal injury to the Sponsor within six (6) months from the date of injury: if I fail to do so, I agree that I will have waived any and all rights I have to recover against the Sponsor for said injury.

Additionally, in consideration and acceptance of my entry by the Sponsor and the right to participate in and attend the Show and related activities, I consent to receive any and all emergency medical treatment as may be deemed appropriate under the existing circumstances as then determined by the Sponsor or its agents. I also grant Sweet Briar College permission to use my likeness, voice, and words in television, radio, film, or in any form to promote activities at Sweet Briar College. I also understand that there will be no refunds.

(Following portion pertains only to parents or guardian of a participant who is 17 years of age or younger.)
